

Inclusive Higher Education vs. Disability Services

- All schools offer disability services, not all offer inclusive services
 - You might not always know what is right for a student
 - Ask the colleges
 - Wait and see, knowing that college is an option
- Helpful hints (beyond "intellectual disabilities")
 - Not accepted via traditional means
 - Support in various domains (social, career, academic, etc.)
 - Non-degree seeking
